- Members took part in monthly local walks, usually accompanied by refreshment.
- A group of ladies spent an interesting afternoon at a Calligraphy Workshop and are now able to produce beautifully handwritten Christmas cards.
- We helped with the decoration of the re-vamped village hall, and on a very wet December evening we helped the local Lions with their Santa Sleigh Collection for local charities. The WI's chosen charities this past year were the Rainbow Centre, Scarborough
- Christmas also saw us entertain other local WI groups at our Area Christmas Party where refreshments and communal singing, and games, were enjoyed by all.
- Charity work featured again with our members knitting over 70 trauma teddies, during 'lockdown', for the local Emergency Services
- When we were struck by the Covid-19 lockdown, we persevered, managing to move our Book Group to Zoom, which we then expanded to include discussion around topical Podcasts as well as books.
- To help us all keep in touch during lockdown, we set up a Thornton Dale WI WhatsApp group

 get through the alphabet, not once, but three times. In addition, a monthly 'Newsletter' was
 circulated to members keeping them up to date with any activities and offers of assistance
 with shopping etc.
- In September we held our first meeting under Covid-19 restrictions. Our speaker was Pauline Closier, who gave a very interesting and illuminating talk on her adventures with her husband and dogs on their Coast to Coast walk.
- As we move on, with the prospect of further restrictions, we are planning to make a quilt in memory of a much-loved member who recently passed away. Members are encouraged to add their own squares. We are planning quizzes and YouTube tutorials for various craft projects.
- Members have also been given information about the online courses being offered by Denman at Home.
