4. The Committee will not be responsible for any accidents or loss of exhibits, but will take reasonable care to safeguard against any such occurrence.
5. The Judges appointed are empowered to disqualify any exhibit which they detect to have been trimmed or tampered with.
6. The Judge's decision to be final.
7. All matters in dispute to be relegated to the Committee.
8. The Committee reserve the right to cancel any class in which there are insufficient entries, or to withhold any one or more prizes.
9. Objections (if any) must be given in writing to the Secretary by 3.00 p.m. on the day of Show. The sum of 50p to be deposited with the Secretary, which sum will be forfeited if the objection be deemed to be frivolous, but returned if sustained. Any expenses incurred must be paid by the person against whom the Committee give their decision.
10. All the Silver Cups are the property of the society and are for annual competition. To be held by the winners for one year only.
