Gritting Various issues have been raised regarding gritting since the weather turned wintery. The link below should give you a good overview and I have appended the "assessment form for the provision of a salt bin / heaps" to this report.

I am awaiting the return of several emails regarding the implementation of a gritting policy made several years ago. I support the removal of grit bins / heaps where they are not required or used, but my concern is that changes are being made when the bad weather is already upon us. I have raised this matter with the executive member and Highways Area 4 who are looking into this matter.

Other concerns raised have been the gritting of roads around the school and Church Lane. I am assured that no changes to the gritting routes have been made however I am awaiting further clarification.

Gas Third Energy (Knapton Generating Station) has made a formal request for a Scoping Opinion from the County Planning Authority. This is a procedure in advance of a formal planning application expected in March April time. It is doubtful that the parish of Thornton Dale will be adjacent to the application site so as such will not be statutory consultees.

RDC are holding a residents information meeting to discuss the development of unconventional gas in Ryedale on 4th February. The meeting was by ticket only to ensure that our Ryedale residents rather than out of district resident were given priority for seats. I believe this is to be recorded / televised so if you don't have tickets there will be an opportunity for you to catch up with what went on. It is likely that other meetings on the topic will follow on from this.
